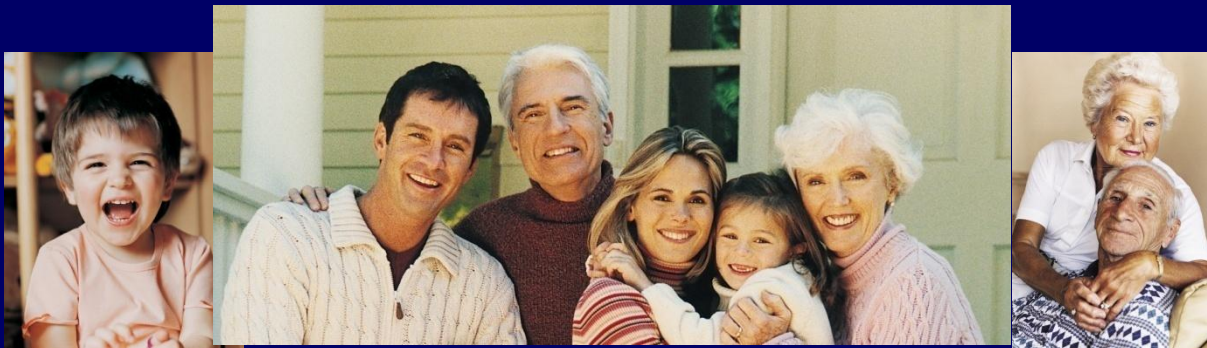

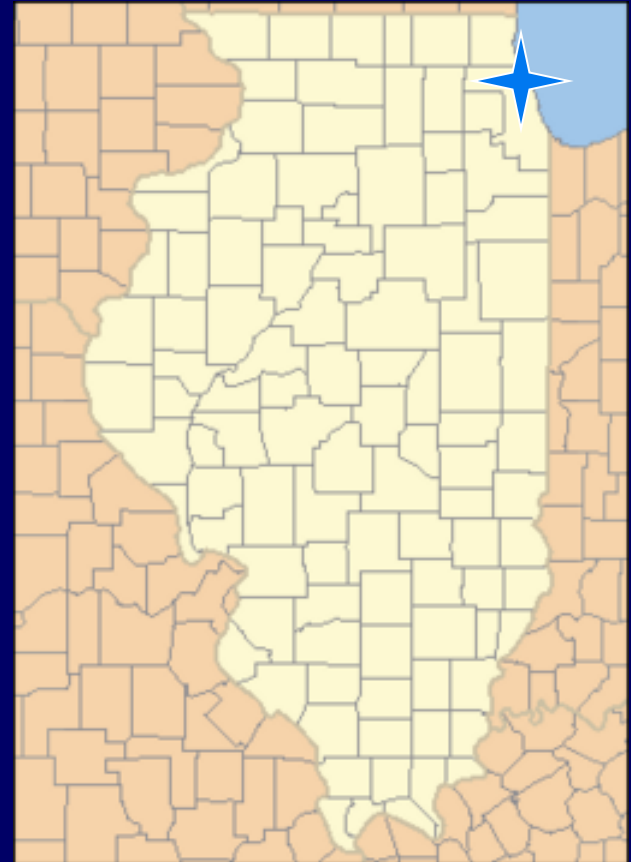
Township Government in U.S.



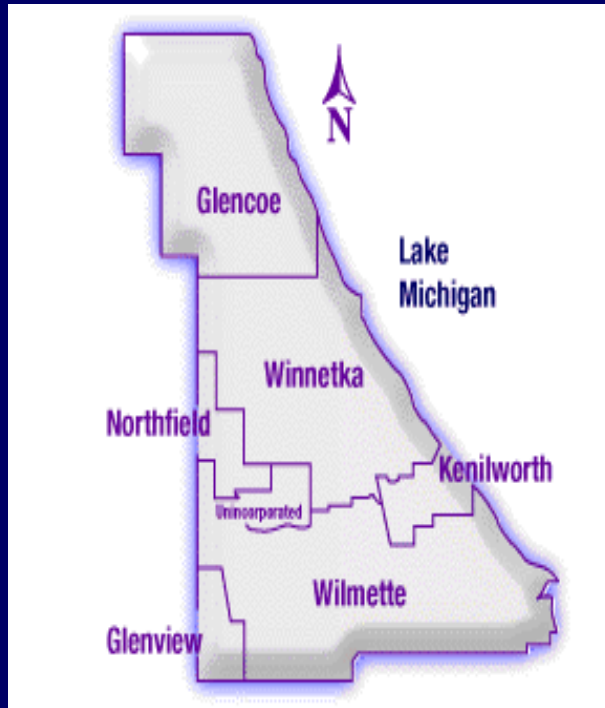
- ❑ **Founded in 1636**

- State mandated function

- Income and assets eligibility criteria



Angel Fund

- ❑ Provides emergency assistance to qualified residents to pay for food, shelter, utilities, clothing, medical care and other necessities

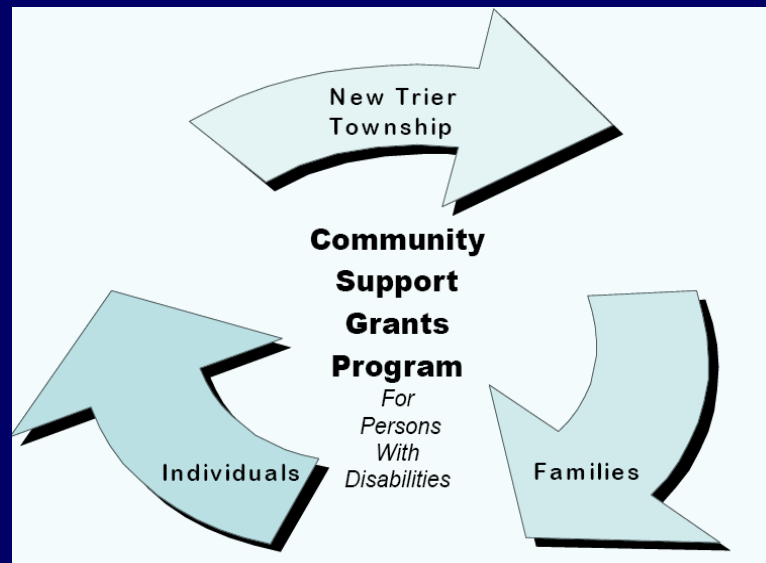

Community Support Grants for Persons with Disabilities

- ❑ Innovative pilot program launched in September 2007
- ❑ Cash reimbursement program
- ❑ Provides up to \$1,500 per person/ per fiscal year
- ❑ Must be Township resident
- ❑ Covers a wide range of services
- ❑ No income or age restrictions



Social Service Agency Grants

- **FY11 Grants = \$1.09 million**
- **45 programs**
- **33 social service agencies**
- **Annual Funding Process**



Social Service Agency Grants

- ❑ Individuals and Families in Crisis
- ❑ Developmental Disabilities
- ❑ Mental Health Services

Peer Jury Program

- ❑ Provides a means for young offenders to account for their behavior to a group of their peers.
- ❑ The ultimate goal is for the offender to consciously decide to avoid further illegal behavior.
- ❑ Close to 400 cases*
- ❑ Nearly 12,000 community service hours*

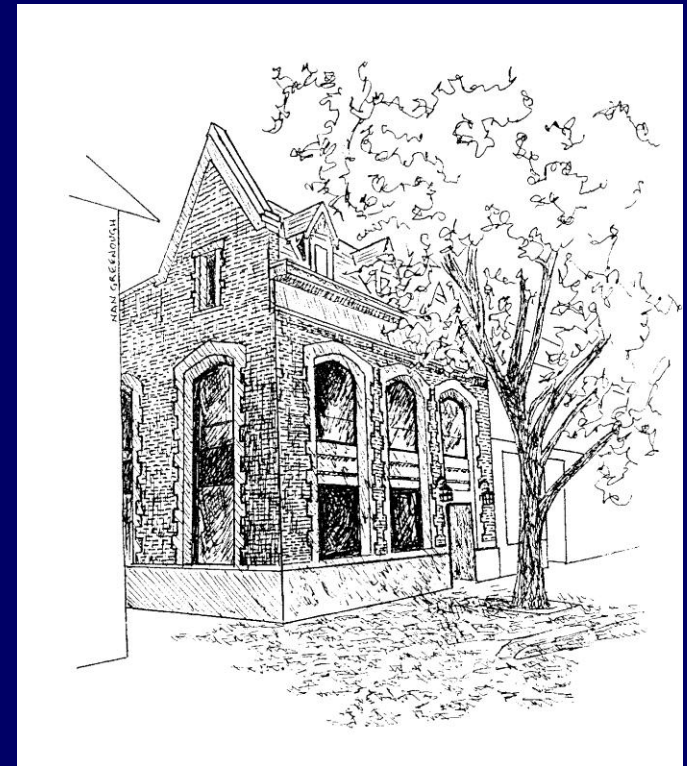
